**WALTER, MABLE, LARRY**  
**Sergeant Mable Rose McKee Jaworski**, 685 - 2nd WAC Detachment, Signal Corp. PARIS, 1944  
 Operated switchboard in Paris military, maintained calls from Paris to Eisenhower's Headquarters in Germany. Trained French civilians to take over after war ended. (Both of her brothers in the photo are now deceased. Mable is now 86 yrs. old.) SENT IN BY MABLE



**LT. LARRY BROWN, USAF**  
 The late husband of Janet Brown of N. Wildwood. Larry flew 35 missions while piloting Flying Vixens from 1942-1945 in WWII. Before the war ended, he was training with Gen. Doolittle to fly the B-29.


**Joseph & Lillian Trombetta**

**Supply Officer in Cape May, NJ**  
 On left is Brinley, who served in the US Navy and was stationed in Cape May. After his discharge, Mr. Smith co-owned with his wife, Cecile Orsini Smith, the **Carriage Stop Motel** and the **Internationale Motel**, now **Atlantis** at St. Paul and the beach. They also owned & operated **Fitzharris Restaurant**, now **Duffy's on the Lake** at Farragut & Sunset Lake. The other names in the photo are not identified. Anyone know their names?
